Mrs. Lyons states that the Commission received land use applications which are available on the Commission OneDrive account. The Commission received the monthly land use report from Russell Stern and a letter from Senators Bucco, Steinhart and Space to DEP Commissioner LaTourette and an email response from Commissioner LaTourette's office regarding Lake Hopatcong Commission funding.

VIII. Chairman's Report

Chair Smith states that the Commission received a supplemental environmental project proposal from Weldon. The Commission's attorney is reviewing the proposal. He states that the weed harvesting program has received positive reports from residents about weeds.

X. Administrator's Update

Colleen Lyons provides an update on her activities. She states that on July 8th she made a presentation on boat wash stations to the Morris County Park Commission. On July 9th she attended the Boating Regulation Commission meeting at the Lake Hopatcong Yacht Club. She provides an update on grant activities. She states that all documents under the 319 Grant have been submitted and are under review by NJDEP for final payment approval. She states that the 2021 NFWF grant plantings are complete and the State Park, Princeton Hydro and Commission are discussing

plantings at the state park to use remaining funds from the grant. The 2024 NFWF grant for Witten Park is in its planning stages.

XI. Weed Harvesting Report

Mr. Calderio states that the crew is getting ready to move the north team to Ashley Cove. Two machines are staying south of Brady Bridge to harvest Great Cove and Crescent Cove. He states that 848cy have been harvested to date.

XII. Lake Hopatcong Foundation Updates

Kyle Richter provides and update on Foundation activities. He states that he attended the Mayors Meeting in June. Deputy Commissioner Kati Angarone also attended. He states that the Floating Classroom educational cruises are running during the summer. The Gala is on Thursday with auction bidding open online. He states that 20 tons of shrink wrap have been recycled so far this season. Marty Kane provides and update from the Museum. He states that the open house for the 60th anniversary will be on September 12th. The Museum was awarded \$30,000 Historic Preservation Planning Grant. He states that they hope to build a barn on the property with State Park approval. Lee's County Park Pavillion is still finishing construction, but they are taking event reservations. An open house will be announced.

Princeton Hydro Updates

Dr. Fred Lubnow provides an update on Princeton Hydro's activities on the lake. He states that water quality monitoring will be completed July 29th and Cyanotoxin monitoring on July 16th. He states that clarity is slightly better than this time last season. He compares June 2024 data and June 2025 data stating that Secchi depth readings were greater in 2025 and phosphorus levels on average are lower. Dr. Lubnow reviews grant progress stating that Princeotn Hydro submitted a proposal to Jefferson Township to apply for funding from the Highlands Council for an aquatic plant survey. He provides and overview of the Army Corps ERDC grant funded treatments that occurred earlier in the season in Crescent Cove and Ashley Cove. The treatments aim to prevent harmful algal blooms. He states that in 2026 Princeton Hydro will complete a cost benefit analysis of the treatments with ERDC funding. Commissioner Steinbaum asks about progress toward an oxygenation system. Dr. Lubnow states that they will continue to look for funding and the reports and public meetings are complete.

Dr. Lubnow states that the projects around the lake do address nitrogen. He states that the ERDC treatments focus on overwintering cells. He states that the "flu" could be due to cyanotoxins in the water.

George Cronk – Benedict Cove states that he is a new resident and is inundated with weeds. He requests harvesters assist in his area.
